TABERNACLE CHRISTIAN SCHOOL Dual Enrollment & Dual Credit

In accordance with our core values (*Unity, Growth, and Purpose*), we are excited to offer students at Tabernacle the opportunity of Dual Enrollment and Dual Credit!

Definitions

- 1) *Dual Enrollment* is when a student enrolls to take a college course while still being enrolled in high school.
- *2) Dual Credit* is when a student enrolls to take a college course, while still being enrolled in high school, and receives dual credit (one grade applied towards both high school and college credit requirements).

School Policy

At Tabernacle, eligible students may register for a class that is *equivalent* to the one being offered *concurrently* at Tabernacle. There are various reasons for this policy, some of the more important ones being:

- 1) This policy provides a pathway for the student to *re-enroll* in the required credit needed to graduate from Tabernacle should the student struggle with the college course and decide to drop the class.
- 2) This policy allows the teacher within the classroom to be available to assist the student with any subject-related questions they might have while completing the course.
- 3) This policy, in accordance with our school's mission to establish a Biblical worldview, allows the teacher within the classroom to be a sounding board for Truth as the student is likely to be taught course material through secular ideologies in opposition to it.

Please check with the school first before registering for any college classes so we can assist in finding the best path for Dual Enrollment and high school graduation. Families may do so by filling out the *Dual Enrollment Application* form located on the school's website under the *Online Resources* tab here.

Student Eligibility*

- High school juniors and seniors
- Approval from HS guidance counselor / administrator
- Unweighted 2.75 GPA on 4.0 scale and in good standing with the school

Course Registration Stipulations*

- *Equivalent* to the class being offered *concurrently* at Tabernacle (e.g., a college math being taken when Tabernacle offers the individual's grade-level math)
- Online software must be compatible with Tabernacle computer usage (i.e., students cannot use their own devices on campus)
- Limit to one per semester
